Program Description

The Equity and Social Justice Department offers a 25-credit certificate in Multicultural Understanding. This certificate is designed for those who wish to develop awareness, knowledge and skills in issues of race, social class, gender, ability and sexual orientation with an emphasis on social action in personal spheres of influence. Especially useful for those in the workplace, this program offers practical and usable skills in multicultural understanding and can be completed in face-to-face courses, hybrid courses, or fully online.

The program includes an introductory course in Multicultural Understanding, followed by a variety of courses in American Ethnic Studies, Communication, Education, English, Gender and Women’s Studies, History, and Sociology. Learners can select courses in their particular areas of interest; all of these courses focus on issues of power and privilege in developing multicultural understanding. The program concludes with a capstone seminar in Social Justice, including a service learning component.

The Multicultural Understanding Certificate is open to all learners at Shoreline Community College. All courses can apply toward the Associate in Arts—Direct Transfer degree. Those who are interested in pursuing a bachelor’s degree in multicultural understanding should follow a planning guide in a related field such as American Ethnic Studies, History, or Gender and Women’s Studies.
