The **Associate in Music** degree in **Classical Voice** requires 99 quarter credits in courses numbered 100 or above and a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher. This degree is suitable for students interested in entering a conservatory or seeking a terminal degree at Shoreline Community College with a music emphasis. For students planning to transfer to a baccalaureate college or university in Washington State, the AA-DTA Music transfer degree is the more appropriate degree option. **See the reverse side for a complete listing of courses that fulfill general education and distribution requirements.**
